## Trip Planning Meeting

It was April Fool's Day but we weren't fooling around when it got down to trip planning. Nancy Borremans led the club through the process and came out the other end with thirteen extended trips for the 2009 season. There is a planning calendar below and brief descriptions and prices are detailed on the next page.

(Folks who attended the meeting may notice that the trip to Winter Park, CO, proposed for the end of the season, does not appear on the schedule. Unfortunately, we decided to cancel that trip. Both airfare rates and cabin rental fees increased substantially, for an overall 60% increase even before considering the effects of additional baggage costs, etc.)

To sign up for one or more of these trips, you **must make a deposit**. Obligations made by Kick 'n Gliders Nordic Ski Club to reserve facilities needed to run a trip are sometimes non-refundable. Therefore, participants should consider all

deposits to be non-refundable.

**Trip deposits will be accepted by the Treasurer beginning now. The full deposit amount must be submitted in order for a member to be added to a trip roster.**

Depositors' names will not be entered onto a trip roster until after October 1. If necessary, a lottery will be held shortly after October 1 to determine the order in which members who made early deposits are added to the trip roster. Couples making joint deposits for a trip will be considered together, not as individuals. Trip leaders are exempt from the lottery.

Deposits must be mailed to the club at Kick'n Gliders, PO Box 1353, Mechanicsburg, PA 17055.

Deposits postmarked or received on or after October 1 will be added to trip rosters in the order deposits are postmarked or received.

## Dealing With Fuel Costs

We're still in denial but the real value of fuel is finally beginning to beat its way into the American psyche. Gone, forever, are the days of cheap gasoline, care-free driving and gas-guzzling monster vehicles for most of us. But, does that also portend the end of Kick 'n Glider trips to distant cross-country ski venues?

Consider the 1,000 mile round trip to Craftsbury. Load two people and your gear into a mid-sized SUV that gets 18 mpg on trips. With fuel at \$4/gal that's more than \$100 per person you need to add to the trip's price when considering your skiing budget. Fuel prices will put the cost out of reach for some of us.

Alternatively, squeeze three people and their gear into a 32 mpg, gas-sipping, small car and you're looking at about \$40 per person for fuel. That's a real savings of \$60 per person and nearly 25 gallons-of-gas-worth less hydrocarbons and CO<sub>2</sub> emissions dumped into the atmosphere of our shrinking planet. Carpooling and smaller vehicles work, but at the price of planning and a bit less luxury while on the road.

Of course, we could choose not to go. Or we could travel by fuel-sipping rail or bus transportation. But, this continent is not well-equipped to do that ... yet.

Other ways to reduce our fuel costs and pollution impact is to run longer trips, ergo more days of skiing for the same fuel. Longer trips is a clear trend for the club; we're running six trips of four or more nights this year. No, this is not part of some foresightful planning on our part. Rather, it reflects the ageing of our club's membership and our ability to spend more time on the road. But it also happens to match up with the fuel situation.

In the interests of our planet and your pocketbook, please consider carpooling this season. It will be interesting to see the impact on our club. Things will not remain the same.
